

Wildland Fire Support for Communities

Fire Management Assistance (FMAGP)	DHS-FEMA	State, local governments, Tribes	The FMAGP funds the mitigation, management, and control of any fire burning on publicly (non-Federal) or privately owned forest or grassland that threatens such destruction as would constitute a major disaster. The Fire Management Assistance declaration process is initiated when a State submits a request for assistance to the FEMA Regional Director at the time a “threat of major disaster” exists.
