Rationale/Notes:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ICT3 is complex. Wildland fire has Extended Attack incidents as well as Type 3 Incident Management Teams (IMTS); each requires variable skills from the ICT3 in command. With the implementation of Complex Incident Management, the path forward on the wildland fire side is still unclear.

Rationale/Notes:

- Need to know wildland fire nomenclature to effectively communicate.

Summary:

The analysis team determined that:

- LOFR, ICT4, ICT2, and ICT1 – endorsement recommended. The endorsement will include additional NWCG requirements as identified above.
- ICT3 – no endorsement recommended. All-hazards Incident Commander Type 3s will need to meet the wildland fire endorsement for Incident Commander Type 4 before moving up to Incident Commander Type 3. ICT3 is complex. Wildland fire has Extended Attack incidents as well as Type 3 Incident Management Teams (IMTS); each requires variable skills from the ICT3 in command. With the implementation of Complex Incident Management, the path forward on the wildland fire side is still unclear.
