<p>Fire Environment Mapping Systems (FEMS) Update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purpose- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide consistent framework to implement fire danger-based decisions. ○ Current system has not kept pace with technology and policy. ○ Utilize best available science and technology using geospatial gridded format for fire weather and fire danger information. ○ Provide authoritative data source for historical and forecasted weather and fire danger data. • Problems- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Existing Fire Environment data storage and access methods do not meet current needs. ○ Weather observations/forecasts, National Fire Danger Rating Systems (NFDRS), fuel moistures and lightning data are not easily accessible. ○ IT systems must be upgraded to analyze NFDRS data. ○ Storage and service must be resolved for applications such as Wildland Fire Decision Support System (WFDSS). ○ End users require updated web display to effectively access and analyze. • Objectives- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Create new web based FEMS application. ○ Modernize long term storage via collaboration Data Cache Program. ○ Create geospatial gridded and station base data services for hourly weather and NFDRS observations and forecasts. ○ Cloud-based application to meet current Weather Information Management System (WIMS) needs. ○ Enables integration of FireFamilyPlus, Wildland Fire Assessment System (WFAS), KCFAS, WFAFE. • Business Benefits- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Accessibility to all wildland fire applications/systems. <p>Incident Record Creation Policy and Guidance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Duplicate records are intentionally being created within integrated systems. Circumventing NWCG Business rules: one ignition, one record. ● Local dispatch centers have authority to create these incident records. ● Limit ability to accurately assess costs and maintain fiscal accountability to the incident, creates payment issues, contributes to inaccurate fire data, and jeopardizes credibility. ● Specifics- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Local dispatch centers are being directed to create a duplicate record when a fire burns onto and different jurisdiction or dispatch boundary. ○ Creating a duplicate record to allow for use of specific agency’s procurement method. ○ Government entities are instructing to create duplicate record for fires originating on federal lands. ○ Creating “in support of” incidents that mirror an incident that they do not host. ● Recommendation- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 1) Establish policy for incident creation within the integrated environment in chapter 11 & 19 of the Interagency Standards for Fire and Fire Aviation Operations. ○ 2) Establish clear guidance for incident creation within National Mobilization Guide.
